License Defense vs. Professional Liability. What's the difference?

License Protection coverage is activated when a complaint is filed against your license. License Protection is typically not included within employer provided professional liability insurance.

| LICENSE DEFENSE | PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY |
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| > Inquiry by the State Board of Nursing, arising from a complaint | Civil lawsuit arising from a patient's malpractice claim |
| > Allegations can be related to clinical practice and/or may be of a nonclinical nature (i.e., substance abuse, unprofessional behavior, or billing fraud) | Allegations are related to clinical practice and professional responsibilities |
| > The State Board of Nursing can suspend or revoke a license | > The civil justice system cannot suspend or revoke your license to practice |

State Board of Nursing Responsibilities

- Provides oversight of nursing practices
- Charged with protecting the public
- Enforces laws governing nursing practice
- Make decisions regarding discipline
- Issues nursing licenses


